Parsha Questions

- 2. What is a bribe? How would that affect a court case?
- 3. What are the laws of a slave?
- 4. How do you handle damages from an animal? What's your responsibility?
- 5. What are the five factors in each case to decide the amount owed?
- 6. What two things are you not allowed to mix together in a Kosher home? What are some examples of things some Jewish homes have in order to keep this Mitzvah?

Parsha Answers

- 1. Jewish Court, when two Jews have a disagreement they are not allowed to go to a non-Jewish court- its actually considered a Chilul HaShem!
- 2. A bribe is giving any form of money, gift or item that might cause someone to lean towards being more lenient or kind to you. (Example: Going to the judge before your case and sending him and his wife on an all expense paid vacation to the bahamas as a birthday gift)
- 3. If someone steals and doesnt have the money to pay back for what was stolen, the Beis Din sells him as a slave. For six years or until Yovel, the person has to work. HOWEVER, the master has certain laws he has to follow regarding the treatment of his slave. 1- whatever food he eats, he has to give to his slave 2- if there is only one pillow in the house, Mr. Slave gets it 3- the owner is responsible to take care of not only the slave but also his family 4- the slave cannot be given embarrassing work to do.
- 4. If a domesticated animal hurts someone the owner is responsible for 50% of the damage that the animal caused. If the animal continues to cause damages after 3 times, the owner is fully responsible for all costs. However if its a wild animal that has been trained, from the first attack, the owner is responsible for all damages.
 - 5. Damage, pain, medical expenses, unemployment, embarrassment
- 6. Milk and Meat- we have separate dishes, placemats and sometimes even separate sinks and/or fridges!.
