· · 1. Who was Yisro? Why was he so important?



- 2. In what way did Moshe teach a very special lesson in honoring your parents?
- 3. What was Yisro's idea when he saw that Moshe was judging all of the Jews disputes?
- 4. What was the criteria to be a judge?
- 5. Why was the Torah given in the desert?
- 6. Why did HaShem tell Moshe to ask the women first when it came to accepting the Torah?

Parsha Answers

- 1. Yisro was Moshe's father-in-law, the high priest of Midyan and the mind behind the improved judicial system. The fact that Yisro converted once realizing that HaShem was the only G-D was a very big event. He was looked up to and followed by many people and this conversion was big news.
 - He ran out to meet Yisro and after his conversion Moshe himself served Yisro by his celebratory party.
- 3. He recommended that Moshe appoint other judges to help lessen the amount of cases Moshe had to judge over. (The Jews also didnt have to wait as long)
- 4. They had to be good leaders, who were wealthy so they could not be paid off to make a false judgment. They had to fear HaShem, not people and they had to be 100% honest.
 - 5. The desert doesn't have an owner, anyone can go, we learn from here that no matter who you are the Torah is available for you to learn.
 - The second reason was because the desert is full of endless sand so too the reward for learning Torah is endless
- 6. The women are the ones who raise the children and give them their first taste of Torah.
