Rabbi Hecht Highlighting Important Yahrzeits

This week, our students learned about two Torah giants on their yahrzeits.

On Monday (13 Adar), we learned about Rabbi Moshe Feinstein zt"l (1895-1986), a leading decisor of Jewish law in the latter half of the 20th century. We discussed the role of a *posek*, who applies timeless Torah principles to respond to new questions and situations, with humility and sensitivity.

On Wednesday (15 Adar), we reflected on the life of Rabbi Chaim Kanievsky zt"l (1928–2022) on his first yahrzeit. We discussed his extraordinary commitment to Torah learning, and took away a lesson in the importance of perseverance from his own account of how he was able to achieve his goals only after failing and trying again.
